FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

When Cindy and I moved to Paw Paw, we planned to live, work and retire here. Our retirement plan included buying a motorhome and traveling year-round. As chance would have it, we have fallen in love with the residents and the children of the town. Because of that affection, we have decided to retire here in the community well after we retire. Why should my plans matter to you? Because you need to know both Cindy and I have a vested interest in the future of Paw Paw and the school.

With that in mind, please understand that my top priority is the future of the school and the success of our children because they are the future of Paw Paw. In the coming months, the board and administration will be faced with some difficult choices concerning staff and programs. Our goal is to keep everything we can while working toward a balanced budget. Given the current fiscal issues in the state of Illinois, this is a very difficult process. We need your support and understanding to make this work to keep our school doors open.

We are also committed to keeping our tax rate as reasonable as possible and have taken steps to refinance most of our debt in order to keep tax levies from rising drastically. If these steps had not taken place, our county bond levy would have gone up by 60% over the next two years. The board has been proactive in an effort to maintain level taxes as well as allowing me to work toward a balanced budget.

This is all possible because Paw Paw is a great small town in which the community pulls together and everyone works toward what is best for others. I cannot stress strongly enough how essential it is to keep this school viable well into the future. As many of you know, once a town loses its school, it also loses its heart. My overriding goal for Paw Paw is to see this district survive well beyond my years as Superintendent. I hope you will join both the board and me in that effort and work alongside us in these very difficult financial times.
