FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

Welcome back to a new school year. So far, the year looks promising for our students. We have new staff, which have made numerous positive impacts and are in the starting stage of a District Leadership Team tasked to develop plans of action to improve the district and begin the move forward. Both of those are primary factors in my strong belief that Paw Paw Schools are on their way toward a fantastic future.

Typically, when I write for the newsletter, I try to choose a topic which needs to be addressed on a community level. This month and this year, we will be focusing on attendance. There are an enormous number of studies published every year about factors which point to future success in both college and careers. The two factors, which always find their way into the top two, are student GPA and attendance. Of those two, GPA is primarily a result of student/teacher influences, but attendance is often a result of parent support and exemplars.

This all means that improved attendance is very likely to improve GPA and also have a positive correlation to future success. More importantly, this points to how much Paw Paw schools depends on parents to ensure that our students are here every day possible so they can get the most out of their educational opportunities. Excessive absences make it extremely difficult for children to grasp concepts taught during those absences and is also compounded when a child needs to learn the concept and catch up on missed work.

With all of the data pointing to a need for better attendance, we will begin focusing on how to improve student attendance. To that end, some parents may be getting letters throughout the year informing them of a need to have a doctor's note for an excused absence if they have reached, or surpassed, the state mandated definition of a chronic truant, which is a limit of 5% of school days and includes excused absences. That number is currently nine days in the last 365 days. Note this number is not reset each new school year: instead we go back to the same date one-year prior.

Please note: this does not mean children can't miss school. This simply means we are focusing on getting students in a classroom as much as possible. If you have any questions or need clarification, please feel free to call either Mr. Schneider or myself and we will be happy to discuss the issue with you. I look forward to a GREAT school year and watching our children blossom and grow.

"GIVE A CHILD A HEALTHY SMILE" DAY



On Nov. 11th, Whiteside County Health Department mobile dental clinic will be coming to Paw Paw School to give dental exams to children whose parents choose to take advantage of this opportunity. This service is available to all children, ages 3 – 14 and Paw Paw must meet the requirement of 15 children for the clinic to come to Paw Paw. The mobile dentists' team consists of a dentist, hygienist and dental assistant, who provide dental examinations, cleanings, fluoride treatment and sealants (if necessary) for your child. Whiteside County Health Department is a provider for Medicaid/Kid Care and most insurances. It offers grants to children in need who don't have dental insurance or Medicaid/AllKids. It also has a subsidized fee of \$40 for those not qualifying for a grant.

The State of Illinois has mandated that all students in Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grade must have a dental examination for this school year between May 16, 2015 and May 16, 2016. This will meet that requirement

Watch for your child to bring home a bright green permission slip for the mobile dentists. This is a wonderful opportunity to get them preventive dental care in a very easy way.

Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grade students may also fulfill the state requirement at a dentist of their choice.
